CALL FOR PAPERS



The 40th SEMINAR for ARABIAN STUDIES will be held at the BRITISH MUSEUM on **Thursday 27th - Saturday 29th of July 2006.**

The **SEMINAR for ARABIAN STUDIES** is the only international forum which meets annually for the presentation of the latest academic research in the humanities on the Arabian Peninsula (including archaeology, epigraphy, ethnography, language, history, art etc.) from the earliest times to the present day or, in the case of political and social history, to the end of the Ottoman Empire (1922).

If you wish to give a paper at the Seminar please send a 200-word abstract before the 15th of February 2006 for consideration. The abstract must set out what the paper intends to cover, the approach it will take and indicate the broader academic significance of the topic. All abstracts received by the February deadline will be considered by the Steering Committee in early March and will be selected on the basis of quality, content, and importance of the topic. Please note we can normally only accept one paper from any given project.
